1 2 3	Nippard:	Alright(unintel) anyway. So what's the date? Date and time now. I don't know – April 10 th at 9:06 in the morning. So yeah, Scott, if you can just go through – I know you got a call from Warren
4	Harris:	Yeah.
5	Nippard:	on that night, April 5 th , and what you guys did from there.
6 7	Harris:	Yeah. Ah, as was April 5 th , this past Sunday if I remember correctly, ah, shift workers are bad with dates
8	Nippard:	Yeah.
9 10 11	Harris:	ah, I'd say it was around, I guess, (phone ringing) two or three, first got a message. I guess we have a group message – messaging board that we use, the five of us, to
12	Nippard:	Uhm.
13	Harris:	you know, let – let us know that something's on the go.
14	Nippard:	Okay.
15 16 17 18 19	Harris:	(unintel) who got the message to be honest with you offhand. Ah, that we had an officer involved in a shooting. At that point then we started coordinating, you know, trying to figure out what was happening. Ah, so I got a call around, jeez remember off the top of my head now, I'd say shortly before four, four-thirty, five-ish around there, and it was Warren.
20		Ah, we were gonna head out to, ah, out to Holyrood Detachment there on

the Holyrood Access Road to, ah, to meet up with Joe. You know, we had

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been advised that he had been transported there, ah, so then two of us 1 drove out. Got there, again not making any notes or nothing, so five-2 thirtyish, around that time, ah, met with Joey. It was myself and Warren 3 Sullivan, Staff Sergeant Mike Adams was there and, ah, Sergeant Reg 4 Tilley, who's Acting Staff Sergeant now or not. Ah, two of those guys were 5 handling the, I guess, critical incident stress debriefing. And we go out 6 there, I guess, for representation of our member, ah, as part of the 7 Association so Association representatives. So we'll have to provide legal 8 counsel, you know, advise him what their rights are, what their – what's 9 expected of 'em. 10 Nippard: Uhm. Okay. 11 Harris: But rarely fellows there in these types of situations a lot of times they don't 12 know what they're required to do, what they're, you know, ... 13 Nippard: Yeah. 14 Harris: ...and – and they're – they're in a tizzy as it is, for lack of a better term. 15 Nippard: Yeah. 16 Harris: Ah, so goes out, we sat down, mainly to provide support for Joe. I mean, 17 18 you guys were great and realized the fact that, I mean you know, he – he - it's not ideal for him to provide a statement at that time. So really we just 19 sat with him while he was waiting for, ah, with his clothing dropped off 20 cause you guys wanted to seize his clothing. Ah, so we sat with him, 21 chatted. I mean, he – we didn't enquire as to what happened or anything 22 like that. We didn't question him. We didn't want him talking. I mean, you 23 know... 24 Nippard: 25 Yeah. Harris: ... that's not in his best interest. Not in the best interest of the 26

investigation for him to be provide a statement at that time.

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1 Nippard: Yeah.

2 **Harris:** Ah, you know, he – he did give, I guess, through our talk, I mean, he felt

like he wanted to get it off his chest. You could tell by just sitting with him,

4 right.

5 Nippard: Yeah.

6 **Harris:** So he talked and he gave a quick overview. He – he said he was out, ah,

checking on a threat to the Premier, ah, or investigating some comments

were made on social media. And he mentioned that, I – I think it was next

door, don't quote me on that again I don't – we don't take notes for stuff

like that, ah, ah, it's his brother, either brother-in-law or brother of the the -

the individual involved, next door. He spoke to with him first. Went over

and spoke with the individual involved, ah, and at that point which all he

told us was that he was in talking to him, the guy was up and down, all of

sudden he was – he was making notes, saw a barrel come up and drew

his firearm at that point, dropped his notebook and started moving towards

the door. Ah, ... (unintel)... like you know. He – he reiterated that a

couple different times, in a couple different ways. We were chatting

throughout and we were trying to keep his mind off it talking about all

kinds of random, different things. Joey used to work with the Association

with us ...

21 **Nippard:** Okay.

22 **Harris:** ... so, ah, you know, talking about things like that. He still sits on our

Finance Committee, you know, working on purchasing land over there,

you know what I mean.

25 **Nippard:** Okay.

26 Harris: Just all kinds of random stuff. Just talking about family life, you know,

27 how's the kids, that kind of thing. Just trying to keep his mind off it.

I mean, at no point was he changing his story or saying something different that didn't – that he hadn't said before. It was just, you know, he was coherent, he was consistent. Nothing was saying he was alarming in any way with regards to, you know, something malicious that was done or – or wrong.

8 9	Nippard:	I got the vibe from the other guys too that he kind of – he was very eager. He wanted to talk about it or he wanted

20 21 22	Harris:	So then we had to try to convince him cause, you know, like the other guys said, you know, he just – he – he wanted to talk. He wanted to get it off his chest, right.

24 25	Harris:	Ah, so we, ah, we had to recommend to him that, no, it's, you know, it's not in your best interest. It's not in the investigation's best interest for him

Cause, you know, when it comes to survival stress there's so many things goin' on with you at that point. I mean, I – I think he – he mentioned, ah, his, ah, his blood pressure had been taken afterwards and he was up at a hundred and eighty or something like that over
