 25 A. Brown or something, I think. It was brown

 2 MS. O'BRIEN:  
 3 Q. Do you remember anything else about it,  
 4 whether it looked new or old? Do you  
 5 remember any kind of details like that?  
 6 MS. LINEHAN:

 8 know, but it was—all I know it was some kind  
 9 of rifle or shot gun or something. I do  
 10 know that. It wasn't like a little pistol  
 11 type thing.  
 12 MS. O'BRIEN:  
 13 Q. Okay, and what position was it on the floor,  
 14 do you recall?  
 15 MS. LINEHAN:  
 16 A. It was, I think it was like the butt towards  
 17 the chair, the barrel away from the chair, I  
 18 think, as far as I can remember.  
 19 MS. O'BRIEN:  
 20 Q. And was it lying flat on the floor?  
 21 MS. LINEHAN:  
 22 A. Oh yeah, it wasn't like propped up against  
 23 anything that I can remember. I don't think  
 24 so, and in saying that, I'm not—because I  
 25 can't really remember.
